

A FEW WORDS

As 2017 has marked the 10th anniversary of the Global Institute for Water, Environment and Health, we believe it is time to focus on the major water challenges of the last decade, what has been successfully achieved and what remains to be done.

In the past ten years, the already scarce water resources have been further stressed by the increasing demand for water and the uncertainty engendered by climate change. To that challenges can be added new dangers of increasing water pollution and untreated wastewater issues posed by rapid population growth and urbanization.

Additional mismanagements of water resources have engendered dramatic threats such as major deterioration of ecosystems, disruption of water supplies, and growing diseases due to unsafe drinking water. Within the last decade, countries have been experiencing important water shortages, leading to the emergence and resurgence of regional and international water conflicts, in such places as Syria, India, Brazil, Somalia and Kenya.

Today, we are experiencing a paradigm shift in how we assess and address water challenges. Under the impulse of the UN Sustainable Development Goals, we are moving beyond basic access to water to addressing more difficult challenges. There is an obvious change in targets, from former MDGs basic goals of access to improved water sources and improved sanitation facilities for all, to the emergence of more complex and interlinked challenges of protecting water resources, ensuring sustainability, and targeting the most vulnerable ones. As a result, the responses have been shaped to adapt to the complexity of the challenges, and new concepts of integrated water resources management have appeared.

At GIWEH, we believe that we are witnessing a historic moment. The coming years will mark the cornerstone of progress based on inclusion, cooperation and integration. Water for all, by all! Time has come to move away from the outdated policies, and to adopt new solutions based on adaptation and resilience. GIWEH has already taken the lead and is highly committed in developing innovative strategies and projects that fully encompass cross-sectorial cooperation and bottom-up approaches.




