Targets 6.5 and 6.6 of the Sustainable Development Goals are challenging targets with many dimensions. What for instance are the parameters that need to be monitored to indicate that a water resources system is being managed in an 'integrated' manner at all levels, including successful cooperation at the transboundary level? What do we need to measure to know that water related ecosystems are being protected and restored? This side event is conceived as an expert meeting which will look at the SDG water targets from a legal perspective, aiming to show that legal analysis helps to develop the road map for implementation of these goals.
